Changed from POM to P medicine Change from supply of 1 tube to 2 tubes. Under records to be kept – added GP (if registered) as service is open to patients not registered to a GP. Changed signature of person supplying the medicines to 'record' of person due to electronic record of supply. Patient advice – addition of advice about sugary foods.
Nystatin suspension	Vicky Vincent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Age group that PGD intended for has been changed from 1 –12 months to 1-4 months. Over 4 months now recommend purchase of miconazole oral gel over the counter (in line with CCG self-care policy) Exclusion criteria – children over 4 months of age added, children with diabetes, haematinic deficiencies or poor dental hygiene added If breastfeeding mother with nipple candidiasis, then miconazole 2% cream can be supplied through another PGD. Under records to be kept – added GP (if registered) as service is open to patients not registered to a GP. Changed signature of person supplying the medicines to 'record' of person due to electronic record of supply.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exclusion criteria – added males, to highlight consider sepsis, also no more than 2 episodes of UTI treated with antibiotics in the past 12 months (previously said 2 episodes treated under this PGD). • Taken out – additional contraceptive precautions as per national guidance and SPC. • Additional self-care information added, and TARGET UTI leaflet link included. • Aiming for less patients to be treated with antibiotics for less severe symptoms of UTI and instead use self-care. • Under records to be kept – added GP (if registered) as service is open to patients not registered to a GP. Changed signature of person supplying the medicines to ‘record’ of person due to electronic record of supply.
Trimethoprim	Vicky Vincent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Altered inclusion criteria to fit with the diagnosis of urinary tract infections: quick reference guide for primary care https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/urinary-tract-infection-diagnosis • Exclusion criteria – to highlight consider sepsis, also no more than 2 episodes of UTI treated with antibiotics in the past 12 months (previously said 2 episodes treated under PGD). Added known hepatic insufficiency, highlighted methotrexate as a serious interaction, rare hereditary problems of galactose intolerance, the lapp lactase deficiency or glucose-galactose malabsorption and acute porphyria. • Taken out – additional contraceptive precautions as per national guidance and SPC. • Additional self-care information added, and TARGET UTI leaflet link included. • Strengthened information so that trimethoprim can only be used in patients with low risk of trimethoprim resistance. • Under records to be kept – added GP (if registered) as service is open to patients not registered to a GP. Changed signature of person supplying the medicines to ‘record’ of person due to electronic record of supply.
